Re: Waiver of Conflict and Consent to Representation Regarding an Agreement for Veterans Services

Dear Mr. Lewis and Mr. Alger:

Leelanau County (Leelanau) has asked us to review an Agreement (Agreement) with Grand Traverse County (Grand Traverse). Under this Agreement, Grand Traverse will provide veterans services to Leelanau. The term of the Agreement covers the period of January 1, 2025 through December 31, 2027.

In the role of reviewing the Agreement and counseling Leelanau regarding the Agreement, our representation implicates the rules governing attorneys and potential conflicts of interest. Specifically, the Michigan ethics rule governing attorneys provides:

Rule 1.7 Conflict of Interest: General Rule.

- (a) A lawyer shall not represent a client if the representation of that client will be directly adverse to another client, unless:
 - (1) the lawyer reasonably believes the representation will not adversely affect the relationship with the other client; and
 - (2) each client consents after consultation.
- (b) A lawyer shall not represent a client if the representation of that client may be materially limited by the lawyer's responsibilities to another client or to a third person, or by the lawyer's own interests, unless:

- (1) the lawyer reasonably believes the representation will not be adversely affected; and
- (2) the client consents after consultation. When representation of multiple clients in a single matter is undertaken, the consultation shall include explanation of the implications of the common representation and the advantages and risks involved.

We do not reasonably believe that our representation of Leelanau in this matter will adversely affect Grand Traverse. The risks are, of course, that Leelanau and Grand Traverse may ultimately disagree over our opinion regarding the Agreement. However, at this point we have no information from which we can reasonably conclude that such disagreement will occur or that our representation of either party would be adversely affected.

In addition, it does not appear that any confidential information or documents which we received in our representation of Leelanau and Grand Traverse would be material to this transaction. Further, we will not use or reveal any information relating to our representation of either Leelanau or Grand Traverse except to the extent that such information is generally known.

However, although there does not appear to us to be an actual conflict under Rule 1.7 of the Rules of Professional Conduct, because Leelanau and Grand Traverse are valued clients of this Firm, we are required to request under the Rules of Professional Conduct that Leelanau and Grand Traverse knowingly and voluntarily waive any potential conflict, and that you be informed and consider the implications, advantages and risks of doing so.

If after full review and consultation you decide to waive the conflict or any potential conflict and allow us to represent Leelanau and Grand Traverse in this matter, please sign your copy of this letter and return it to us. RE: TVC Phase I Terminal Expansion Bonding


Northern Michigan is a special place, and we are lucky to call this region home. As the stewards of Cherry Capital Airport (TVC), the Northwest Regional Airport Authority (NRAA) is constantly looking for and assessing opportunities to improve our community asset for the residents of the region. Based on recent trends and our commitment to enhance options for locals and drive economic prosperity for the region, we believe it is time to expand. This expansion will allow us to better serve our constituents through competitive travel options and increased economic activity. It takes vision to support a project of this depth that will set our community up for long-term success. We are honored for the opportunity to partner with you and use your insights to ensure this project benefits our community for the next 100 years.

Airport traffic at TVC has nearly doubled in the last decade. More people are enjoying the spectacular offerings of Northern Michigan. Over time, the addition of new airlines and flights have created a crowded airport experience for travelers, especially in the busy summer months. Key functional spaces critical to the movement of passengers and baggage are now undersized for the sheer number of travelers today. As a result, passengers are experiencing delays, increased wait times, and overcrowded spaces.



The NRAA is proposing to build the first phase of an expansion to its commercial terminal building and supporting apron. This includes the following program elements:

- 5 new gates with associated boarding bridges and departure lounges
- Relocated and expanded TSA security checkpoint
- Expanded outbound baggage area
- Additional restrooms
- Additional amenities (for example: Mothers Room, Adult Changing Room, and Service Animal Relief Area)
- New concessions areas



While expanding the terminal to meet these demands, the NRAA desires to take advantage of potential federal, state, and local funding available for this work. Anticipated sources of funding for the proposed development program include the following: Airport Improvement Program (AIP) Entitlement Grants, AIP Discretionary Grants, Bipartisan Infrastructure Law - Airport Infrastructure Grants (BIL-AIG), Bipartisan Infrastructure Law - Airport Terminals Program (BIL-ATP) Grants, State of Michigan Grants, NRAA funds, and bonding by the NRAA to be paid with Airport revenues. A detailed financial analysis was completed by Ricondo Associates to help the NRAA map its funding obligations, opportunities, and cash flows. The result of this analysis estimates that the NRAA will need to bond approximately \$60 Million to complement the \$60 Million provided by other funding resources to meet the expected \$120 Million cost of the program.

When the NRAA was established in 2020, Grand Traverse and Leelanau Counties maintained consent to approve the issuance of debt by the NRAA where the full faith and credit of a county will be pledged. It is anticipated the NRAA will be asking for a pledge of Grand Traverse County's full faith and credit in


connection with the portion of the project that will be paid for by NRAA revenue bonds. The request for a pledge of the full faith and credit of Grand Traverse County to back the debt issuance by the NRAA is to enhance the attractiveness of the bonds to investors and lower the overall borrowing costs. Because of Section 107 of the Michigan Revenue Bond Act, it is the NRAA's understanding Leelanau County would not be able to pledge its full faith and credit.


The NRAA is seeking requests for proposals for bond counsel and a financial advisor to assist the NRAA with the bonding process. Once bond counsel and a financial advisor are selected by the NRAA, the NRAA would like to present the project as well as the debt plan to the counties at a joint meeting the week of October 14. Following the joint meeting the NRAA will be asking for approval of the NRAA's issuance of bonds for this project.
