
FIRE PREVENTION EDUCATION

Annual Call Comparison




TOTAL CALLS FOR SERVICE YEAR-TO-DATE

A MESSAGE FROM THE CHIEF

OCTOBER WAS ONE OF OUR BUSIEST MONTHS OF THE YEAR SO FAR. IN CONTRAST, OCTOBER WAS ONE OF OUR SLOWEST IN 2023. DRY AND WINDY CONDITIONS CERTAINLY CONTRIBUTED TO OUR INCREASE IN CALLS. ALONG WITH ALL OF THE INCIDENT RESPONSES WE WERE ABLE TO DISTRIBUTE SOME FIRE PREVENTION MATERIALS DURING VISIT TO GLEN LAKE SCHOOL. MANY THANKS TO THE SCHOOL FOR HAVING US PRESENT THIS GREATLY NEEDED INFORMATION TO THE STUDENTS AND STAFF.

NOVEMBER BRINGS THE START OF FIREARM DEER SEASON. I KNOW MANY OF OUR COMMUNITY MEMBERS PARTAKE IN THIS TIME HONORED TRADITION. IF YOU DO PLAN TO VENTURE INTO THE DEER WOODS PLEASE FOLLOW SOME COMMON SENSE RULES FROM THE MICHIGAN DNR:

- TELL SOMEONE THE SPECIFIC TIME, DURATION AND LOCATION THAT YOU WILL BE HUNTING AND SCHEDULE CHECK-IN TIMES. UPDATE YOUR CONTACT IF PLANS CHANGE. MEDICAL INCIDENTS ARE UNPLANNED STAYING IN CONTACT WITH SOMEONE WHO KNOWS YOUR PLAN COULD SAVE YOUR LIFE.
- HUNT WITH A PARTNER AND KNOW YOUR ZONE-OF-FIRE.
- CARRY A TWO-WAY COMMUNICATION DEVICE THAT RECEIVES SERVICE IN REMOTE AREAS SUCH AS A PHONE OR TWO-WAY RADIO. ENSURE THE DEVICE IS ALWAYS WITHIN REACH IN CASE YOU NEED TO CALL FOR HELP.
- HUNTING ON OR NEAR WATER? WEAR YOUR LIFE JACKET.



FINALLY, OUR TRAINING AT PYRAMID POINT WITH GLEN LAKE AND THE NATIONAL PARK SERVICE AGAIN SHOWS OUR COOPERATION BETWEEN AGENCIES IN THE COUNTY. I MAY SOUND LIKE A BROKEN RECORD BY TALKING ABOUT THIS OFTEN BUT WE TRULY ARE FORTUNATE TO HAVE EMERGENCY RESPONDERS THAT ARE ABLE TO WORK TOGETHER TO COMPLETE WHATEVER MISSION WE ARE GIVEN. THE LEVEL OF COOPERATION WE HAVE IN OUR COUNTY IS UNCOMMON AND SOMETHING TO BE PROUD OF!
