

PHYSICAL ABILITY TESTING



Annual Call Comparison




TOTAL CALLS FOR SERVICE YEAR-TO-DATE


MONTHLY CALLS BY TOWNSHIP

IN MAY WE WERE FORTUNATE TO LEARN OF A TURNOUT GEAR GRANT PROGRAM THAT IS SPONSORED BY THE STATE OF MICHIGAN. THIS GRANT, IF WE ARE AWARDED IT WILL ALLOW FOR THE PURCHASE OF A SECOND SET OF TURNOUT GEAR FOR OUR MEMBERS. HAVING SECOND SET OF GEAR INCREASE OUR ABILITY MAINTAIN READINESS IF RESPOND TO AN INCIDENT IN WHICH OUR GEAR BECOMES CONTAMINATED FROM SMOKE, ASH, OUR OTHER HAZARDOUS CONTAMINANTS. WITH OUR SECOND SET OF GEAR WE WOULD BE ABLE TO OUICKLY CHANGE OUT OUR PPE AND CONTINUE ON WITH OUR SHIFT WHILE OUR SOILED GEAR IS BEING CLEANED.

DURING THE MONTH OF MAY OUR MEMBERS ALSO CONTINUED TO ATTEND VARIOUS TRAINING PROGRAMS ACROSS NORTHERN MICHIGAN.
