7. Brief Description (purpose of funding); include statement of need:

The Leelanau County Historic Preservation Society (LCHPS), a 501c3, requests \$76,000 of a \$152,000 project to make the Poor Farm Barn facility available for limited seasonal public assembly to benefit the residents of and visitors to Leelanau County. Public assembly requires a change-in-use of the barn facility to Building Code category Assembly Group A-3. This request is to support the costs of egress and public restrooms, and requirements for the Americans with Disabilities Act.

The Leelanau County Historic Preservation Society holds a 25- year lease from Leelanau County for the county poor farm barn and surrounding two acres within the Myles Kimmerly Park to rehabilitate and find public uses for it. Appropriate use/s will engage community and be appropriate to the public park setting. LCHPS, in cooperation with Leelanau County Parks and Recreation Commission has decided to explore making the barn available for public use. We have begun an architectural study, and occupancy, and ADA approvals are necessary to accomplish this. The barn is the only remaining structure of the county’s poor farm that between 1901 and 1961 cared for those county residents needing a place to live and contribute to the workings of this intended self-sustaining farm. The number of residents varied from 9 to 40 occupants at any one time. The Native American population, as best we can determine, ranged from 5 to 12 percent of this yearly total.

Between 2017 – 2023, the Poor Farm Barn has been rehabilitated and preserved by LCHPS. This is the focus of our organization: to save the barn and enhance the facility as a part of the Myles Kimmerly Park (just west of Maple City), one of the parks within the Leelanau County Parks system. Safety and accessibility codes and requirements require changes to the facility.

This grant will help make a large impact on residents and visitors utilizing Myles Kimmerly Park (one of three Leelanau County parks) by making the Poor Farm Barn available for public assembly during the summer months for music, arts, and other public programming. The site also maintains a 50’ X 140’ vegetable garden in partnership with non-profit Row-by-Row which provides food to area food pantries, Good Will Inn, Food Rescue, Father Fred Foundation and 5loaves2fish.
