
Village of Empire Planning Commission Recreation Plan Update Questionnaire Responses







What is the age group of the person filling out this questionnaire? 122 responses






How often do you or members of your family visit a park in the Village?

If you have visited one of the parks in the last year, how do you travel to the park?







(The 2nd question related to travel was ill-advised as it provided no useful additional data). Chart is below. Biking and Walking seemed to be the prevalent transportation mode.




Do you participate in recreation activities (e.g., sports, physical fitness wellness, outdoor play, etc.) as often as you would like? 121 responses



If you answered "no" to the question above, please identify why you cannot participate in recreational activities as often as you would like.




Additional Comments:




Please select the Shalda Park facilities you use the most 95 responses




What Downtown Park amenities do you frequent the most?

Need better signage to help people understand distinction between public and private beaches,

There needs to better signage that educates the public regarding what is public property north of Empire Beach. Presently there is a very small sign that's not worded appropriately regarding public rights and owners rights. This is creating significant problems and it's the city's responsibility to address this problem.

The parking and playground equipment detracts from the natural beauty of the lake.

I wouldn't qualify the open grass by the post office to be a "park". If so, I would add much more there.

Lot's of trash at the beach in the summer

Love the beach parks, but wish more signs were posted stating not to build fires outside of pits. The allowing of fires not in the designated fire pits, takes away from the beauty of the beach.

Would love a bathroom at downtown park.

Beach park could use new fire pits

The fitness equipment is not good for people over 35-40 years. It is hardly used.

There needs to be better monitoring of the waste receptacles at the beach. During busy times, they are overfilled and create unsanitary and an unattractive appearance. This sends the visitors a wrong impression regarding the Village of Empire. Perhaps a "Gator" type vehicle or even a pick up truck could be used to empty them a few times during the busy beach use days. Summer beach employees could do this when full time employees are not available. Job descriptions could be changed to reflect the additional duties.

Never go to Shalda park and didn't know the area by the PO was considered a park.

Quality of beach sand is poor and should be groomed/cleaned regularly.

Covered pavilion needs maintenance and regular cleaning.

I think the downtown park could be more inviting by having some screening plantings between the park and the house in the back, maybe a gazebo and more benches or picnic tables. It doesn't feel like a park. It's just an open space. Nothing invites you INTO the park.

Beach sidewalks and parking lots constantly covered with sand. Condition of pavilion needs work (dirty overhead lights, sand piled inside, structure needs TLC). Beach access points (including/especially the Storm Hill access point) must have any and all rocks removed. No one should have to navigate a minefield to get onto the beach.

Make the parking lot lights night-sky friendly.

Paint arrows/install signs on Niagara roadway entry (the "loop") to beach indicating one way traffic.

New and more fireplace rings, which it sounds like the Village may already be addressing.

More garbage cans, maybe two more. It is obvious that beach area/parking lot usage, especially in summer, has outgrown its capacity. Raise the parking ticket penalty: summer visitors have been heard to say they'd rather take what they consider the small risk of

"possibly" getting a parking ticket rather than pay the hourly parking fees because the difference between ticket cost and hourly fees isn't enough to deter them from chancing not paying the hourly fees.

Shalda park I play with my dogs. Turn one of the ball fields into a dog park.

The sand on the walk ways and road at the beach is uninviting.

The Volleyball coat needs to be rid of rocks. Seen many people hurt their feet.

The baseball fields need to be redone on a yearly basis.

There is no scoreboard at the baseball fields. The fields are used more than what the residents know.

Attention to details are substandard. It's somewhat better this past year, however.

Better/quieter hoops at LM park would be nice. Shalda needs pickleball courts.

The swings at the beach park are excellent for kids to play on. Best swings you'll find at a park.

Our sweet little village is enhanced -- especially for residents == because of our green spaces! -- provided by village as well as businesses -- and resident upkeeps of their areas as well

bathroom maintenance

The beach park is an important access point for walking the beach and enjoying travel to/from the Sleeping Bear -- the increased unfriendliness of private property owners, particularly with improperly placed and/or inaccurate beach signs (e.g., dune restoration below the high-water mark) is a problem for Empire's identity.

Would like to see trash cans available year round. Especially by post office/downtown.

The Empire beach is my favorite place in the whole wide world. All in all I think the village has created a wonderful place to recreate - however I am very dissatisfied with the anthropocentric approach to an ever changing environment by placing massive and dangerous rip rap onto our beach & a sea wall with what seemed like very minimal consultation with professionals in dealing with sustainable solutions for beach erosion. Who knows how these rash decisions will continue to affect one of the greatest beaches in the world for generations to come.

The Downtown Park is not accessible enough and does not have enough picnic tables, or any type of cleanliness.

Beach: need more fire rings (and signage about using them or active patrolling!?) to keep sand cleaner

Would like the beach bathroom to be less disgusting.

The Shalda and Downtown parks need more trees.

Love the idea of creating additional uses for the "park" by the post office!

Beach Park needs less "stuff" becoming too commercialized.

I would like to see more money spent on Shalda Park and (I had not thought much about the downtown park until this survey came along) the little park by the post office (downtown park)

Could do more to make that little "downtown park" better.


Would like to see more at Shalda Park



Could easily add small entertainment pavillion in the park next to post office – while still providing snow piling pace as necessary I strongly support acquisition of the South Bar Lake outflow to Lake Michigan (or relocation of same, which has been considered in the past) -- i.e., spend money on nature not more pavillions and playgrounds. Empire resident taxpayers are paying to maintain the creek and the outflow-drain infrastructure, but private landowners prevent children -- and the otters -- from playing in this creek like children have done for eons. The public pays for this private creek/drain/road for private landowners but there is no public use of it allowed -- the public funds this private drain/creek infrastructure but is not able to use it -- the public cannot traverse the infrastructure they pay for and and is forced to wade the creek -- even in the winter -- when walking the beach.. Public wood fired sauna!!!!

I am new to the Village, but adding more "stuff" at the Beach Park takes away from what makes it attractive.


The Beach park should not be turned into an amusement park.

Public Sauna

Definitely do not add more fitness stations that are not adjustable. Would strongly support REPLACING the existing fitness equipment with equipment that can be adjusted and thus used by different sizes of people. Add more trees (native selections) along the walking path. Assuming water is potable, make the artesian well into an attractive drinking fountain and jug filling station like is on north side of Portage Lake (on portage point drive) in Onekama- or make that area into a garden of water and wet soil-loving native plants (would then ideally fence off area from deer).

Great addition to the Village.



With some planning, this could be a great little entertain space - make sure you don't lose the farmer's market.


The information kiosk could use a make over.

Absolutely no boardwalk or bridge at either park. Huge cost; no benefit to residents.


Boardwalks and Bridges are costly endeavors. It is not just the cost of building, it is also the cost of maintaining that needs to be considered.
