Regular Meeting of the Township Board Tuesday, March 14, 2023 Cleveland Township

Supervisor, Tim Stein, called the meeting to order at 7:01 pm. Present on roll call were, Todd Nowak, Jan Nowak, Tim Stein, Angie Diotte, & Tanelle Budd. Present from the public were Eric Carlson &.

Motion by Todd Nowak and seconded by Jan Nowak to approve February 14, 2023 Minutes. Ayes: 5, Nays: 0. Motion carried.

Public Comment on Agenda- None

Supervisor's Report – Action items: replacing the boat launch at twp park. A1 Outdoor quote for removal of old pieces and reconstruction is \$15,500. This will take up about 80% of the park budget. Robyn Schmidt from EAGLE was contacted and will expedite the contract once ecological surveying and engineering is completed by Grobbel Environmental. The total bid came to \$850, which includes the \$100 permit with EAGLE.

Motion by Jan Nowak and seconded by Angie Diotte to approve contract with Grobbel Environmental for the Boat Launch. Ayes: 5, Nays: 0. Motion carried.

Request from CAFR to include a flyer on wildfire land protection and prevention in our summer tax bills bearing the extra cost of printing.

Brendan Mullen, Managing Director, would like to attend a meeting to report on Leelanau County Road Commission for May.

Clerk Report – Have yet to receive quotes back about our technological issues. I did talk with a few firms to discuss options. Right now it appears that Microsoft Business and access for each person might be the best option and easy to implement and cancel at any time. This might be the short-term solution while we think about upgrading our software server next year. The clerk desktop will need to be replaced and the quotes I'm waiting on, due to supply chain issues, are on hold.

QuickBooks desktop is going to be obsolete May 31st, 2023. They are discounting the desktop versions and moving to online. This is a blessing and a curse, because it makes accessing information easier and has a built in back up, but it will also cost about \$600 year to run the basic program.

Leland Election is scheduled for May 2, 2023. We'll be scheduling the preliminary testing and public accuracy testing soon. Ballots should be arriving later this week.

I have adjusted the checks and disbursement report from a manual Excel report to directly from QuickBooks. This is not only less time consuming, it is also more compliant via employee privacy (not showing net paychecks) and allows for fewer manual calculation errors.

Suggestion to go with a new Audit firm that is cheaper than the current company..
